RIDE THE OAK GROVE BIKE ROUTE

The Oak Grove Bike Route Pilot just opened and is the best east/west route through Menlo Park, especially for Hillview and M-A students crossing El Camino Real. SEE MAP ON BACK.

This route is a one-year pilot. In order for the buffered bike lanes to stay permanently on Oak Grove, sufficient demand must be demonstrated.

Please ride the route! If this pilot is successful, it will make a case for even more bicycle (and pedestrian) safety infrastructure improvements around town in the future.

SAFETY TIPS

- "Drive" your bike. Teach your kids to obey stop signs and look for cross-traffic when coming out of an intersection just as a driver does.
- Be visible. Consider bike flags, reflectors, and bright bike vests.
 Bright helmets are great, too!
- Dismount. Left turns can be intimidating for bicyclists—of all ages. It's always an option to dismount and use pedestrian crosswalks.
- Look L-R-L. Remind kids to look left right—left when crossing a street.
- **Set a good example.** Put down your phone. Obey traffic laws. Be present.



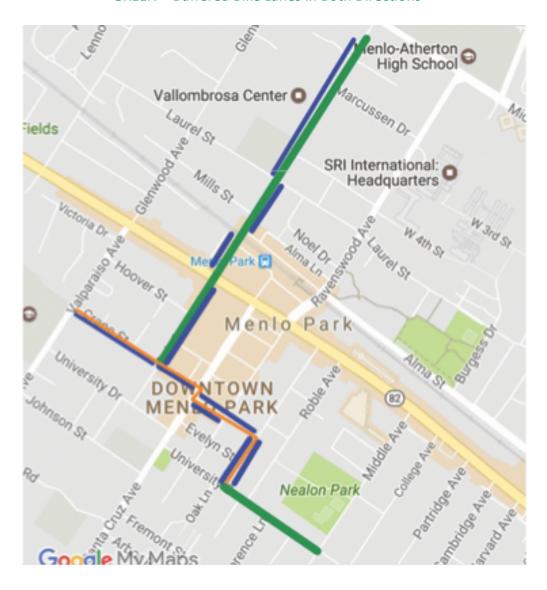
